SHINE UE SCHOOL (SUS) has been authorized to implement the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB DP) in 2018 and an IB World School. Our first graduates have successfully completed the IB Diploma Programme and been awarded a bilingual IB diploma in 2020. ADMISSION POLICY

Admission requirements in the 1st grade:

Generally, we arrange a 3-week preschool program annually, designed to train the children who applied into the 1st grade in Shine Ue school for further schooling. However, we have transferred the admission process to 100% online form and managed online interviews due to the COVID-19 pandemic all over the world. The online interview measures the child's language, memory, stability of attention, and logical thinking skills, and acceptance of the admission is based on the results of this interview.

The main requirement for 1st graders is that they have to be either turning or have turned the age of 6 during that school year. Younger students will not be admitted.

Transferring from another school to Shine Ue school:

The followings are the academic requirements of anyone who is seeking to transfer to Shine Ue school:

- 1. There will be entrance exams of mathematics, English and Mongolian language on the grade level of VI-XII and entrance exams of mathematics and Mongolian language on the grade level of I-V to check the student's education gained prior to applying to Shine Ue school. Mathematics and Mongolian language exams are revised every year and are aligned with the standards set by the Ministry of Education and Science. English exam is revised every year and is aligned with the curriculum of our school. Students with entrance exam results of 70% and higher are admitted to our school, but it's not a guarantee that every student will be admitted.
- 2. If the Admission Committee sees necessary, candidates might be called for an interview accompanied by their parents.
- 3. The accepted students shall bring all the required documents. (The required documents are listed below.)





4. Physical and mental abilities of the child should be taken into account, and expectations of our school should be clearly communicated to the parents before admitting.

The accepted student shall submit the following documents:

- 1. A copy of the student's birth certificate
- 2. Copy of parents' ID cards
- 3. Fill out a student application form (3x4 photos needed)
- 4. Fill out a medical form
- 5. If transferring to our school, shall bring the student's record book
- 6. Deduction from the previous school by ESIS system
- 7. If a student is transferring from abroad to Shine Ue school, the transcripts of the previous school will be transferred to Mongolian secondary school assessment in accordance with the Shine Ue school's assessment policy.
- 8. Pay a fee to reserve a seat (this fee is part of the tuition fee and can be found on the TUITION FEE page for more information).

Admission policy for applying to the IB Diploma Programme:

- Must be an 11th grade student
- Have a thorough understanding of the program and be aware of the graduation criteria
- Must fulfill the following English language requirements:

TOEFL Junior exam score shall be higher than 850 and components shall be as shown below at minimum:

Listening Comprehension – 275

Language Form and Meaning - 280

Reading Comprehension – 295

Parental Presence:

We believe that parents are responsible for the education of their children and their supervision is vital for the overall academic and behavioral outcome of a child. Cooperation between teachers and parents is needed to ensure that students perform at their full potential.

Waiting Lists:

If there is no space available for that particular grade level, students and their parents can choose to be placed on our waiting list. The waiting list is deleted at the end of each school year. Please contact our admissions school manager for completing this process.

If we have offered a space at our school to a student who was waitlisted, and the student did not accept our offer, their names will be removed from that year's list.





Class assignment:

We determine the class students are assigned based on the availability of space, date enrolled and students' age.

Students in grades between 1-5 stay with the same group, but from the grade 6, we mix our students into groups based on the level of English and their interest in the subjects Science and Society. This arrangement helps students to learn to work with other classmates and become more independent and social.

Registration fee:

Registration fee confirms your place for the upcoming school year. This fee will be part of your next year's tuition fee. All students must pay the registration fee by May 31 of that year.

Please note that if students or parents let the school administration know of their transfer after May 31 of that year, they will not be refunded this fee.

Admission process and paperwork needed:

- 1. Schedule an appointment with Mrs. Enkhtuya Tsedevsuren, the admission manager, to take an entrance examination. E-mail address: primary.manager@shineue.edu.mn
- 2. If admitted:
 - a) complete the online application form
 - b) upload a copy of the student's birth certificate into the online application form as an attachment
 - c) bring the student record book from the previous school
- 3. Pay the registration fee
- 4. Meet the homeroom teacher once the student is assigned to his/her class

POLICY REVIEW PROCESS

This policy shall be reviewed every two years from the last date of modification. The last date of modification must be recorded on the policy as a footer note.

Any proposed changes to the policy shall be reviewed by the teachers' meeting with an attendance of at least 70% or above of all teachers. Teachers should use a voting system in approving the proposed changes into the policy.

The approved changes to the policy shall be reviewed and approved by the school administration, which includes Head of School, academic managers, programme coordinator and Heads of departments, if there are no conflicts with other policies and local regulations.

Any final change to the policy shall become effective from the next school year, unless otherwise decided by the school administration.
